- a. I will work to strengthen hate crime and cyberbullying legislation. I will also advocate for stronger Asian representation in school boards and elected positions.
20. In recent months, Maryland has become a 'welcome state' in supporting the transition of refugees arriving from Afghanistan. What proposed legislation and action will you take in meeting the immediate needs of Afghan refugees on a state and local level?
- a. Immigration is crucial to me. I will advocate for expanded ESOL classes, culturally/linguistically competent social workers, housing assistance, and jobs programs

Public Transit

21. In 2018, Gov. Hogan canceled the Red Line. Being that Maryland will have a new governor in 2022, there may be an effort to revive legislation for the Red Line. What is your position regarding the Red Line as a viable transit project in Baltimore?
- a. I am 100% committed to reinstating the red line

- a. I will advocate for fare free transit and a Baltimore regional authority

- a. I will continue to advocate for an execution moratorium extension. In the long term, I'll advocate for rent control and higher density zoning to reduce costs
